



Prof. Dr. Ingrid Ott

Prof. Ott has been a member of the German Federal Government's Commission of Experts for Research and Innovation since May 2014. She is professor of Economic Policy at the Karlsruhe Institute of Technology (KIT) and research fellow at the Kiel Institute for the World Economy (IfW).

After studying economics in Hanover and Madrid, she was a research assistant at the Institute of Economics at the University of Lüneburg, where she was awarded her doctorate for a dissertation in the field of Endogenous Growth Theory in 2001.

From 2002 to 2007, she was junior professor at the University of Lüneburg and held the chair of Innovation and Growth. Between 2007 and 2009, she was head of the research group New Technologies and Regional Innovation Systems at the Hamburg Institute of International Economics (HWI). She received the Venia Legendi in Economics from the University of Lüneburg in 2007.

Moreover, Professor Ott is a board member at the Centre for European Economic Research in Mannheim (ZEW) and was a visiting researcher both at the University of Washington in Seattle/USA and at the Max Planck Institute for Research on Collective Goods in Bonn

Professor Ott has profound knowledge in the fields of innovation and growth theory, cutting-edge technology and regional development.
